Speakers

Nikola Atanassov: Associate Professor at the New Bulgarian University (NBU), Department of Cognitive Science and Psychology. Psychoanalyst, training and supervising analyst (IPA). Research and publications on mentalization and symbolization in patients with personality disorders, Narrative reserach in Psychoanalysis, theory of psychoanalysis. Book: "Developmental Theories in Psychoanalysis". (second edition 2009). Translations of psychoanalytic texts.

Esmina Avdibegovic: Neuropsychiatrist, Ph.D., Associate Professor at the University of Tuzla, psychiatrist and group analyst at the Clinic for Psychiatry at the University Clinical Centre in Tuzla, teaches at the Faculty of Medicine, Educational-rehabilitation faculty and the Department for social work at the Faculty of Philosophy at the University of Tuzla. Publications in Psychiatry ad Neurology. Working with user's organisations, victims and survivors of genocide, torture and war trauma in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Anna Buchheim: Prof. Dr. biol. Hum, Psychoanalyst, Professor for Clinical Psychology, Institute of Psychology, University Innsbruck, Austria. Many publications in the field of Attachment Research and Neuroscience. Specialized in developing and training Adult Attachment Projective Picture Test in German.

Amra Delic: MD, Specialist in neuropsychiatry, Mental Health Center; trained in Group Analysis, EMDR, PCT, Trauma Psychology & Violence Prevention. Research interest: psychosocial trauma, PTSD. Current Research: Long-term Psychological Consequences, Social Support, Quality of Life, Posttraumtic Growth in Women Victims of Wartime Rape in B-H. Member of Federal Medical Chamber, past B-H Psychiatrists' Association Representative in the World Psychiatric Association, Honorary Member: Association Helping the Victims and Survivors of Sexualized Violence in War; Association of Trainees and Young Psychiatrists from B-H. Over 20 conference papers (in conference proceedings), co-author of several articles published, author of the Manual of psychosocial interventions for persons suffering from Schizophrenia, Delic et al., 2012.

Aleksandar Dimitrijevic: Psychoanalyst and Assistant Professor at Belgrade University, PhD in clinical psychology. Specialized in attachment and psychopathology research as well as the mutual influence of arts and psychoanalysis, and conceptions and history of the private self. Engaged in establishing a community mental health system. Many publications in Serbian and English (some translated into German, Hungarian, Italian, Slovenian, Spanish, and Turkish). Editor or co-Editor of five books in Serbian and "Psychoanalytic Encounters. Interdisciplinary Dialogues in Applied Analysis". Editorial board member of *Psihologija* (Belgrade).

Lilli Gast: Vice President and professor at IPU Berlin, professor at Hannover university. Research in Psychoanalytical theory and metapsychology, the history of concepts and theories of psychoanalysis, as well as psychoanalytical subject and gender theory. Ethical dimensions of psychology and their connection with philosophical anthropology. Teaches Theoretical Psychoanalysis and Psychoanalytical Subject and Cultural Theory in the IPU MA Psychology. Influential books on anorexia (1984, 4th. Ed. 1989) and *Libido and Narcissism*(1992) and numerous papers. Co-Editor of the annual *Jahrbuch der Psychoanalyse*.

Andreas Hamburger: Psychoanalyst (DPG), Professor at IPU Berlin, Privatdozent Kassel university, research fellow Sigmund-Freud-Institute Frankfurt/M., training and supervising analyst, Munich Academy for Psychoanalysis (DGPT). Research in and publications on literature and film psychoanalysis, dream and language development, microanalysis of Holocaust survivors' videotestimonies, and psychoanalytic supervision.



Member of the Editorial Board of the German Annual of the International Journal of Psychoanalysis.

Camellia Hancheva: Psychotherapist, Chief Asst. Prof. Sofia University Dept of General, Experimental and Developmental psychology, PhD in Developmental and Educational Psychology. Specialized in Child & Adolescent development and Interpersonal parentchild influence on structure and functioning of child personality. Qualified psychodrama therapist and supervisor. Family and marriage therapist, member of the board of Bulgarian Association of Family therapy. Clinical experience in palliative care & National Oncological Center. Specialized in therapy of children with traumatic loss and mourning. Editor of Bulgarian translations of D. Winnicott and Comprehensive Textbook of Psychotherapy.

Horst Kächele: Prof. Dr, med. Dr, phil,, Professor at IPU Berlin, former chair and head of department for Psychosomatic Medicine and Psychotherapy, Ulm University. Winner of the International Sigmund-Freud-Prize for Psychotherapy in 2001, the Mary S. Sigourney Award (APsA) in 2004, and the Distinguished Research Career Award (Society for Psychotherapy Research, SPR). Extensive research and vast publications on psychotherapy research, author of the most influential three volume textbook on psychoanalytic therapy worldwide (together with Helmut Thomä).

Suzanne Kaplan: Psychologist, child and training psychoanalyst, affiliated associate professor of Education and researcher at The Hugo Valentin Center of Holocaust and Genocide Studies, Uppsala University, Sweden. Former Swedish coordinator for Shoah Foundation. Genocide studies in Sweden and Rwanda. Recipient of the Hayman Prize for published work pertaining to traumatized children and adults (2001 and 2007). Publications on Children in Genocide (2006, 2008, 2013), and (with T. Boehm) on Revenge (2011)

Tatjana Stefanovic-Stanojevic: psychologist, professor at the Faculty of Philosophy, Department of Psychology, University of Niš, Serbia; professor at the Faculty of Philosophy, University of Banja Luka, Bosna-Herzegowina (Serbian Republic). PhD in developmental psychology, specialized in attachment research. President of the Section of Psychology of Close Relationships in the Serbian Psychological Society. Author and coauthor of five books in the field of attachment, editor or co-editor of many publications in the field of developmental psychology. Reserach on attachment, war experience consequences on attachment in populations of former Yugoslavia, and in the field of psychology of close relationships.

Mary Target: Psychoanalyst and clinical psychologist, Professor of Psychoanalysis at University College London (UCL), Director of the Psychoanalysis Unit and the Anna Freud Centre, London. Associate clinical professor at Yale University. Teaching in many psychology study programmes. Influential research publications on attachment and mentalization, together with Peter Fonagy. Current research in social and emotional development and attachment, psychotherapy, experience of illness, clinical training and psychoanalytic conceptualization.

Svenja Taubner: Prof. Dr. phil., Psychoanalyst (DPG), Chair for Clinical Psychology and Psychotherapy, Alpen-Adria-Universität Klagenfurt, Austria, Editor of "Praxis der Kinderpsychologie und Kinderpsychiatrie" and "Psychotherapeut", Specialized in Research on Mentalization, Attachment, Adolescence, Psychotherapy, Neuroscience and Training.

Lutz Wittmann: Prof. Dr. phil, Professor of Psychodynamic Psychotherapy and Psychotherapy Research at IPU and Deputy Managing Head of the University Outpatient



Service at IPU. Research and publications on psychotraumatology, focusing on psychotherapy research, posttraumatic nightmares, peritraumatic dissociation, and trauma specific psychopathology. Lutz Wittmann is member of the Board of Directors of the European Society for Traumatic Stress Studies (ESTSS) and chair of the Special Interest Group Psychodynamic Research and Practice of the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies (ISTSS). Lutz Wittmann serves on the editorial advisory board of the *Journal of Traumatic Stress* and as associate editor of *International Perspectives in Victimology*.
